April 1 - 28

April is traditionally designated as Tsunami Awareness Month in Hawai'i to honor the victims of the April 1, 1946 Aleutian Islands Tsunami. The April 1st Tsunami was the deadliest natural disaster in Hawai'i's recent history, claiming 159 lives. It was also the impetus for the statewide warning system. Federal, State, and Local stakeholders annually sponsor a number of awareness events to educate the public on the dangers of tsunami.
