

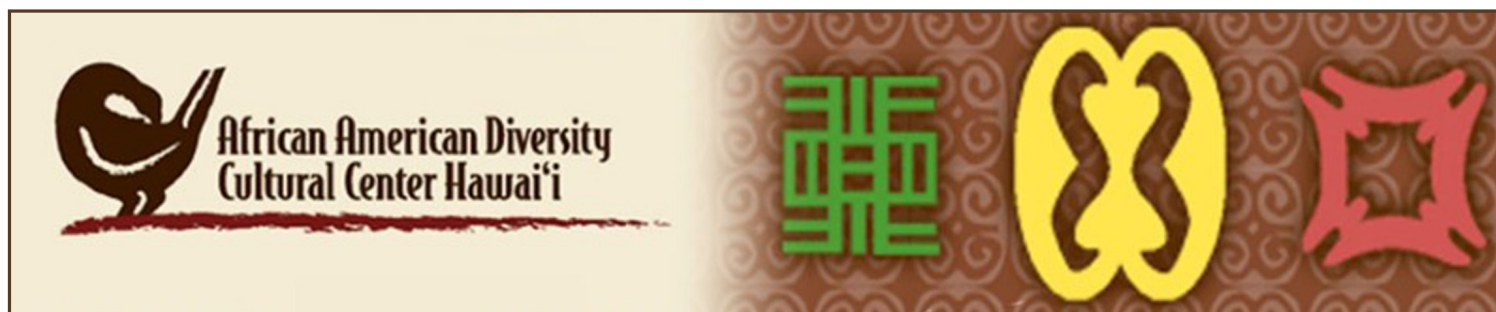

The Sustainable Humanitarian Architecture & Design for the Earth Institute presents a vision for the future of Honolulu's Chinatown. Twelve interns from three universities in Hawai'i and the US Mainland, and ten professional mentors from the fields of urban planning, architecture and landscape architecture participated in this project.

The exhibit features a proposed Chinatown Vision Map, a large scale architectural model of the entire Chinatown District, and five illustrated project recommendations to address current problems and areas of opportunity in this vital urban core area.
