November 1843

November 1850

The first Volunteer Fire Brigade is organized under Chief Engineer William Parke.

November 1874

King Kalākaua and his party depart for San Francisco aboard the steamer *Benicia* for a goodwill tour of the United States. They returned Feb. 15, 1875.

November 1917

Former Queen Lili'uokalani dies at Washington Place at age 78.

October 1966

The first live television broadcast to and from the mainland takes place.


